Dear All,

We are now accepting nominations to attend CDI's 2010 Women in Politics (WiP) course, which will take place from 24 November to 2 December 2010 in Canberra.

The WiP course is held annually and aims to build the capacity of women and men from the Asia-Pacific region who are working toward the goal of improving the representation of women at all levels of public office and politics. It is particularly designed for women intending to enter national politics, whether as a candidate for elected office, a political party organiser, or similar role in the democratic process. CDI particularly encourages nominations from young and upcoming female leaders in our focus countries of Papua New Guinea, Solomon Islands, Vanuatu, Fiji, Timor-Leste and Indonesia.

The course will consist of a mixture of lectures, external site visits, and participatory forums, and will cover key issues for women in politics, including:

- Challenges and obstacles to women's participation in politics
- political parties' role in promoting gender equality in politics,
- electoral and political reforms to maximise
 the role of other actors (including women's representation including temporary special measures (eg. party quotas and reserved seats),
- influencing, lobbying and working with the media
- candidate training (eg. election campaign, resource mobilization, fund raising etc), and
 - government, parliament, civil society, and academia).
