Position Description

POSITION SUMMARY:

The Chief of Party will be responsible for implementing a high-quality, results-oriented program focused on reducing gender based violence (GBV) in Eastern Indonesia. The program's aim is to improve local capacity to serve victims of GBV, raise awareness of the problem, and promote behavior change in local communities. Position will be based in Jayapura, Papua, with project-funded travel in the Eastern Region and to Jakarta as needed. Position is contingent upon receipt of donor funding.

ESSENTIAL RESPONSIBILITIES:

The Chief of Party is responsible for the overall vision, project management, supervision, administration, and implementation of a high-quality program. S/he will establish and maintain systems for project operations; ensure that all agreement deadlines are met and targets are achieved; coordinate and maintain working relationships with project stakeholders (including government and private industry stakeholders, subgrantees and/or subcontractors); and oversee the preparation and submission of technical and financial reports to USAID.

- Manage the USAID BERSAMA project, which includes developing and overseeing annual planning; timely, high
 quality implementation of activities; and monitoring and evaluation of project implementation and deliverables;
- Oversee project budget and ensure that all financial activity is carried out in accordance with annual budget allocations, Winrock policy, and donor guidelines;
- With support from field and home office staff, prepare and submit timely and accurate activity, financial, and procurement reports to USAID and Winrock;
- Maintain close communication with USAID, reporting regularly for formal review sessions and providing ongoing, informal updates of program progress;
- Provide technical assistance, support, and oversight to local partner NGOs to deliver quality deliverables;
- Provide technical assistance, support, and information to national and local government officials;
- Develop strategies for working with local government, traditional leaders, other development implementers, and other stakeholders;
- Hire and supervise local project staff and annually evaluate their performance;
- Represent the project and Winrock to donors, local and national government entities, the media, local NGOs, and the local business community;

QUALIFICATIONS:

Successful candidates will have strong management skills as well as salient experience implementing international programs addressing gender inequality and female empowerment, preferably in Indonesia/Southeast Asia and those funded by USAID. Specific experience and specialization in the areas of GBV, democracy and governance, public health, and/or related areas required. Significant project management experience and leadership is required. Experience working on gender issues in Papua and/or West Papua strongly desired.

Education: Master's level degree required in gender/GBV studies, international development, public health,

political science, or a relevant social science discipline.

Technical Applicants must have a minimum of 10 years' experience working on complex international

development programs, including a minimum of 7 years of demonstrated managerial and/or team

leadership experience.

Strong gender and GBV expertise, along with a commitment to community-based approaches and working with CBOs and CSOs.

Demonstrated experience in at least one of the project's three main objective areas: behavior change; GBV service provision; governmental and/or NGO capacity development.

Management Experience:

- Experience managing international projects to the highest ethical standards
- Demonstrated leadership and administrative skills in the management of complex, multiactivity programming, on time and on budget.
- Demonstrated financial management, budget design, and budget management experience.
- Demonstrated success in motivating and supervising diverse teams of employees.
- Experience in strategic planning and implementation of strategic plans.
- Experience designing and implementing or overseeing monitoring and evaluation systems.
